The power of this machine is such, that rom 450 to 500 pounds of Cotton can be pressed into five yards of 42 inch bagging with considerable ease, and in a very short time. The superior advantages of this machine are clearly manifest, that in addition to the small quantity of bagging required, (which certainly is an obiect) we hands can with great ease, pack from eight to twelve, bales in one day, if the cotton is convenient, by having some assistence in sewing, what is by far the most tedious part. The simplicity of this ma chine and its superior powers are greatly admired by mechanical artists, and in fact all who have seen it.
