Washington, Sept. i. - The debt'statement issued to-day shows the decrease of the public debt during August to be $\$ 6,671,851.71$; cash in treasury, $\$ 351,503,986.22$; gold certificates, $\$ 82,992,740$; silver certificates $\$ 92,651,981$; certificates deposit outstanding, \$12,145,000; refunding certificates, $\$ 334,850$; legal tenders outstanding, $\$ 346,681,016$; fractional currency outstanding, $\$ 6,997,796.31$; decrease since June 3oth 1883 , of \$14,572,442.39.

New York, Sept. 1. 4 The total visible supply of cotton for the world is $1,73^{2}, 705$ bales, of which $1,066,705$. bales are American. against $\mathrm{I}, 336,924$ bales and 542,224 bales respectively last year. The above figures indieate an increase in cotton in sight last night of $395,78 \mathrm{I}$ bales as compared with the same date of 1882 ; an increase of 59,956 bales as compared with the corresponding date of 188 I , and an increase of 485,160 bales as compared with 1880 .

San Francisco, Sept. 3.-The Corean embassy will leave here for Washington on the 7 th inst. An interpreter stated this evening that the embassy would probably remain over one day in Chicago and would then proceed to Washington, where they would stay one month. Three interpreters are attached to the mission, the principal of which is a Chinaman.

A verdict in the case of the State against Columbus Redman, for killing John W. Redman, his first cousin, in New Hope township, this county, on the 18th of April last, the trial of which was entere 1 upon at nocn of Tuesday, 2Ist ult., was not returned until noon of Monday last, 27 th, the case having thus consumed just six days. The jury brought in a verdict of manslaughter, and the judge sentenced the prisoner to three years at hard labor in the penitentiary. - Statesville Landmark.
