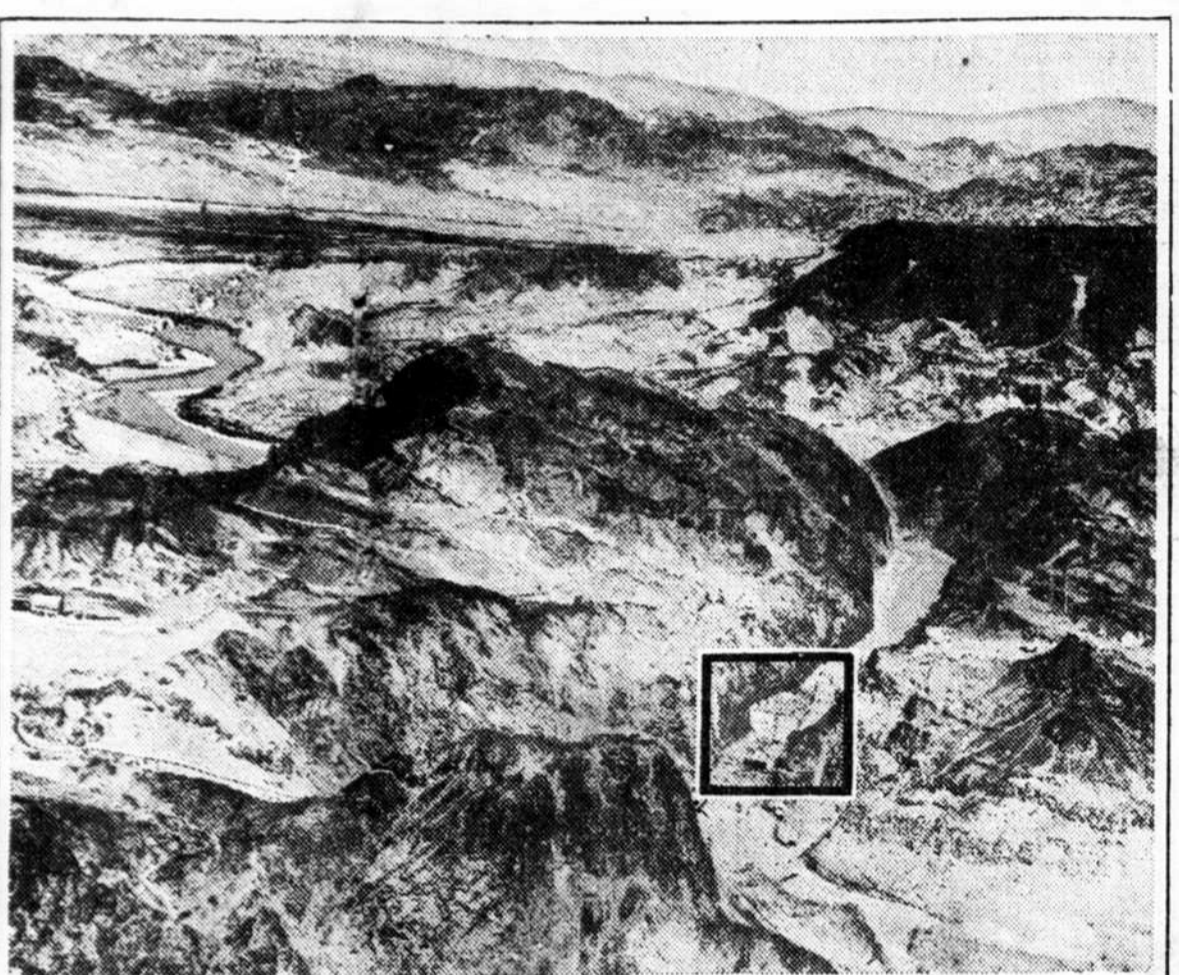
LOCAL DELEGATION IS COMING FROM HEARING
