President Cleveland Names the 26th as the Day.

The President has issued the following : "Thanksgiving Proclamation, By the President of the United States.

"The people of the United States should never be unmindful of the gratitude they owe to the God of nations for His watchful care which has shielded them from dire disaste and pointed out to them the way of peace and happiness. Nor should they ever refuse to acknowledge with contrite hearts their prononess to turn away from God's teachings follow with signal pride their own devices. "To the end that these thoughts may be nuckened it is fitting that on a day especialy appointed we should join together in approaching the throne of grace with praise and supplication.

"Therefore, I, Grover Cleveland, President of the United States, do hereby designate and set apart Thursday, the 26th day of November, to be kept and observed as a day of Thanksgiving and prayer throughout the
