Every person found guilty of permitting any stagnant water, human excrement, animal manure, decaying vegetable matter, filth heaps or any other matter hurtful to health or comfort to remain in any cellar or other place on his or her premises, or premises under his or her control within the the corporate limits of the town, of Warrenton for twenty-four hours after having been notified by the Town Constable or Health Officer of Said Town to remove the same, shall be fined Five Dollars for each offense.

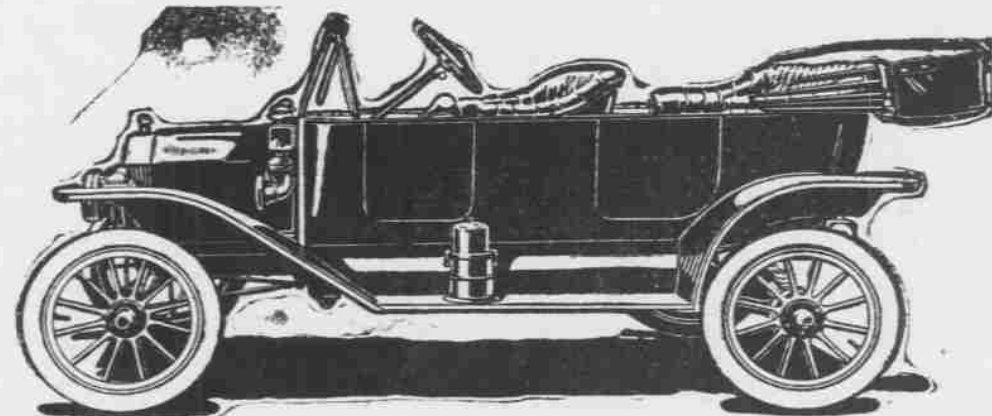
