guished Chaief Magistrate. it will, from the extraordinary position which he has occupied before the country for three years past, possess a peculiar in west. One objection to it may be it repetition o views advanced in for mer messages, and which there is no. the slightest reason to believe wil meet with any favor with the present Congress In urging the repeal of the Tennure of Office Law the Prest dent exhibits a magnanimous disinterestedness. He discusses the finan c al question at great length and certainly presents some novel views. We shall make no extended com ments, but leave our readers to the message i'self.

CONGRESS.

This body assembled at the Capitol in Washington on Wednesday last. The President's message was deliver ed on Tuesday, but the Senate, wi h a little spitefulness which was disgraceful, refused to hear it read. We had sincerely hoped that Cougress would have assembled in a much better humor than it was in when it adjourned, but we shall be disappointed. 
