CHAPEL HILL, Jan. 5—The Armed Forces have dipped into the University of North Carolina's athletic ranks in recent weeks to get six young Tar Heel performers. Hardest hit has been Coach Dan Nyimicz' freshman basketball squad which lost three men. Fenno McGinty, George May and Bryce Newman have cast

their lot with the Air Corps, either Army or Navy. All were considered promising candidates for the freshman team.

Coach Sam Barnes' varsity wrestling team will feel its loss keenly. Gone is Captain Phil Kemp who recently enlisted in

the Air Corps. Kemp is a two-time Southern Conference 155-pound champion around whom the team was built.

The Air Corps has also claimed an outstanding swimmer in Ray Edmundson. Edmundson volunteered last month. He was one of Coach Dick Jamerson's top middle distance stars.
