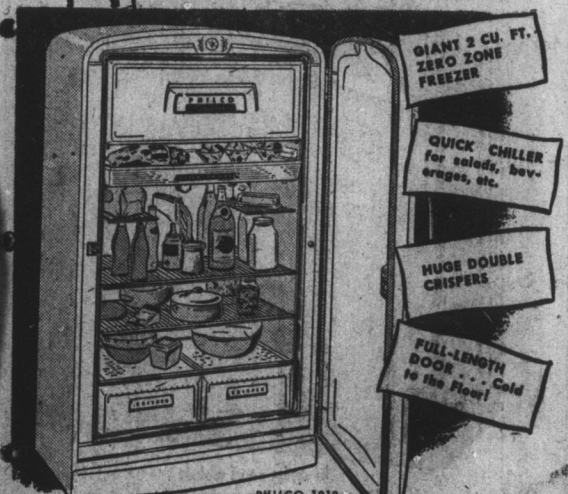

ment and that the committee could vote to release the message if it chose.

The nature and origin of the teletype message referred to by Knowland was not clear.

MacArthur had testified yesterday that he had been directed not to bomb within five miles of the North Korean-Manchurian border.

"Five miles inland I was not permitted to bomb," MacArthur said, adding that this stricture was removed on his protest to permit bombing of bridges across the Yalu River boundary.

When the Chinese Reds started pouring across the Yalu in force, the general said, he ordered the bombing of the bridges from the Korean side. He said that order was "countermanded from Washington and it was only when I protested violently that I was allowed to continue..."
