Nearly 1,000 people attended the opening of the Four-County Fair here last night despite a heavy storm which fell a few minutes after the gates opened.

Hundreds left when the rain started, hundreds of others huddled under the exhibit tents during the storm and afterwards still others trickled in despite the fact that the opener had been rained out.

Two or three of the large tents were badly damaged in the storm, but Chairman J. O. West said today they had been repaired and everything was in readiness this afternoon for a big night.

First-nighters expressed pleasure last night with the attractive farm, home, school and commercial exhibits on display and also with the big midway.

Page's Greater Shows of Wilson are on the midway this year, which is the largest outfit to show here in many years.

The free acts and fireworks were rained out last night, but will be presented tonight. There will be free acts every night and fireworks again on Wednesday and Friday nights.

Four Injured In Accident

Four persons were injured, three of them badly, in an automobile-tractor accident that occurred Monday night about 8 o'clock between Erwin and Linden.

Paul Trice, 40-year-old Negro, was operating a tractor and two of his children were riding on the back of the tractor.

A 1960 Ford operated by Mrs. Thelma Fowler, 41, of Erwin, crashed into the back of the tractor and struck the man and both the children.

Mrs. Fowler told Patrolman William O. Grady and Corporal William C. Trice that a light Trice had on his tractor blinded her, causing the accident.

Mrs. Fowler was taken to Good Hope Hospital at Erwin with a fractured skull and lacerations about the head and chest.

Trice was brought to the Dunn Hospital with a fractured skull, a fractured shoulder and other head and chest injuries.

John Trice, Jr., 13, received a broken left leg and other injuries. Agnes Trice, 12, received deep concussions of the leg and lacerations about the head.
