He was active in church and political circles. Born in Roseboro Community, he lived in this county all his life, He was a veteran of World War One and a member of the Junior Order of American Mechanics. He was secretary and treasurer of the Roseboro Baptist Church, and postmaster of that city for several years.

He was clerk of Sampson County Superior Court for eight years, chairman of the Sampson County Republican Committee in the 1940s and assistant to the Eastern North Carolina Republican Executive Committees as organizer. He had just accepted the position as assistant tax collector of the county at the time of his hospitalization. He was a graduate of Campbell College.
