Catholics Planning Regional Conference

His Excellency, The Most Reverend Vincent S. Waters, D. D., Bishop of Raleigh, revealed this week that the Diocese of Raleigh will be host to a Regional Congress of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine in the spring of 1952. The congress will be under the patronage of the Archbishops and Bishops of the Province of Baltimore. Bishop Waters held an initial meeting last week with Father Francis A. McCarthy of Dunn, Diocesan Director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, and Father Charles J. O'Connor, pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church, Durham. Father O'Connor will be the host pastor to the delegates and guests from North Carolina and the other States in the Province of Baltimore. Father McCarthy will be the general chairman for the congress. The Regional Convention of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine will be held jointly with the 6th annual convention of the North Carolina Catholic Laymen's Association, and the dates have been set for May 2, 3 and 4, 1952. The Washington Duke Hotel of Durham will be the official headquarters for the joint-convention. Besides the official delegates to the North Carolina Catholic Laymen's convention, invitations will be sent to all of the Archbishops and Bishops of the Province of Baltimore, which includes Maryland, Delaware, West Virginia, Virginia, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida and the District of Columbia, and to all priests, sisters and laity within the region. It is expected that many prominent members of the Hierarchy will be in attendance and the convention will witness addresses by many prominent national figures of the laity. As was inaugurated last year at the NCCLA convention, the State winners of the 2nd annual Oratorical Contest will appear on the program, as well as the honoring of the North Carolina Catholic Mother of 1952. Fay Changes From Rabbit Lover To Clothes Horse In "Love Nest"

After an eight year period during which he made theatrical history co-starring on Broadway with an invisible rabbit, Frank Fay is back in the movies—back to stay. A confirmed Californian, with a sumptuous home in the Brentwood area adjacent to Hollywood, the venerable thespian makes an auspicious return in a comedy of post-war apartment house management, "Love Nest" which is showing Sunday, Monday and Tuesday at the Stewart Theatre.

Cast as a distinguished looking gentleman with courtly manners, Fay shares co-star billing with William Lundigan and June Haver in the Twentieth Century-Fox production. A 1943 release titled "Spotlight Scandals" was Fay's last screen role and when it was completed he went east to win the coveted Donaldson Award for his Elwood P. Dowd characterization in the long-run sensation, "Harvey."

Now "Love Nest" sees the veteran dealing with more tangible personages, mostly wealthy dowagers. As a tenant in a ramshackle New York apartment house owned and operated by Lundigan and Haver, who are teamed for the second time within a year, Fay romances and wins the heart of fellow tenant Leatrice Joy another seasoned trouper who is also enjoying a return to screen acting. Fay, who admits to being slightly on the south side of sixty, devotes most of his non-theatrical time putting around the abundant lawn. An ardent amateur agronomist, he boasts that such activities as mowing the lawn, trimming hedges, pruning trees and planting posies keep him in the best of health.
