Benson Native Recuperating

Rev. W. C. Royal, native of Benson, who has been pastor of the Frederick, Maryland Missionary Baptist church for the past 35 years is recuperating at his home, the parsonage, in Frederick following a cerebral hemorrhage suffered some months ago. Rev. Mr. Royal has been identified with varied community interests in the Maryland town, having done voluntary service in Boy Scout organizations, and served as district committee chairman and member of the National Council and the executive committee of the National Capital Area Council. He had conferred upon him the Silver Beaver award, given only for meritorious

service by adults. He has been chairman of the Frederick Playground Commission and took an active part in numbers of campaigns for raising funds in the city. A trustee and member of the executive committee of Storer College Harpers Ferry, W. Va., owned by the Northern Baptist Convention, Mr. Royal has given impetus to many projects of the college. He has served as chaplain of the Masonic Lodge and Odd Fellows Lodge to which he belonged. He has served as chaplain for the Maryland House of Delegates and in the Legislature continuously since 1939.

Rev. Mr. Royal became pastor of the Frederick church August 15, 1951. He has been pastor of the church for 1-3 acres adjoining lands of Lula Lucas, J. W. Matthews and others.
