Dr. Charles Byrd, president of the Harnett County Tuberculosis. Association, brought the *story of the ever-vigilant fight against truberculosis to the attention of the Lillington Woman's Club as the group met Tuesday afternoon at the Community House.

Doctor Byrd, Dunn physician, was introduced by Mrs. A. J. White, public affairs chairman, who ar-ranged the program Mrs. John A. Womble, president, presided.

The visiting speaker illustrated his talk on the fight against tuberculosis with a map of Harnett County showing the location of each tuberculosis case reported, the largest number appearing in the larger populated centers of Dunn, Lillington, Coats and Angier.

North Carolina has only three state sanitoriums for T.B. treatment, Doctor Byrd said. For many who wish to go, there is no room, the speaker said. "And conditions in Harnett," he added, bring this point home forcefully."

However, the physician continued, a State building program at the sanitoriums due to be finished within two years, will remedy this situation. Meantime, he noted public health authorities and private physicians must do what they can for patients who have been refused admission to a sanitorium.
