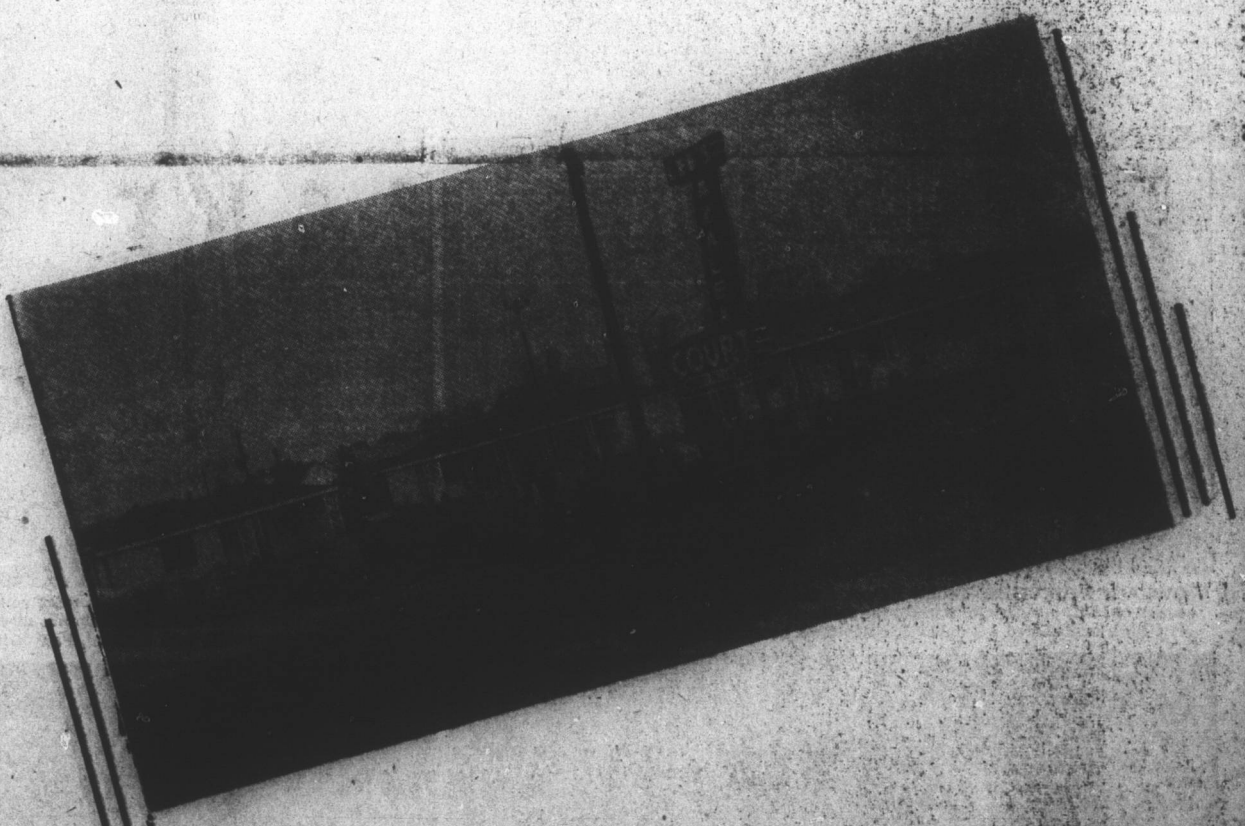
In line with emphasis throughout the North Carolina Synod this month on the work being carried on at the Barium Springs Orphanage, an offering was taken for the

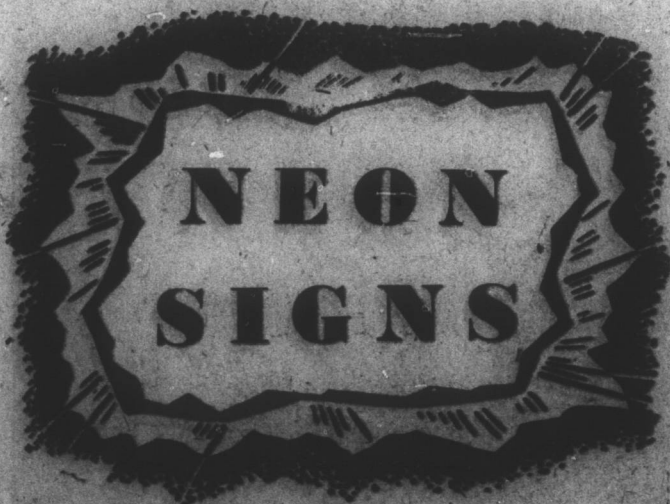
