BUSINESS, PROFESSIONAL CLUB HOLDS MONTHLY DINNER MEETING

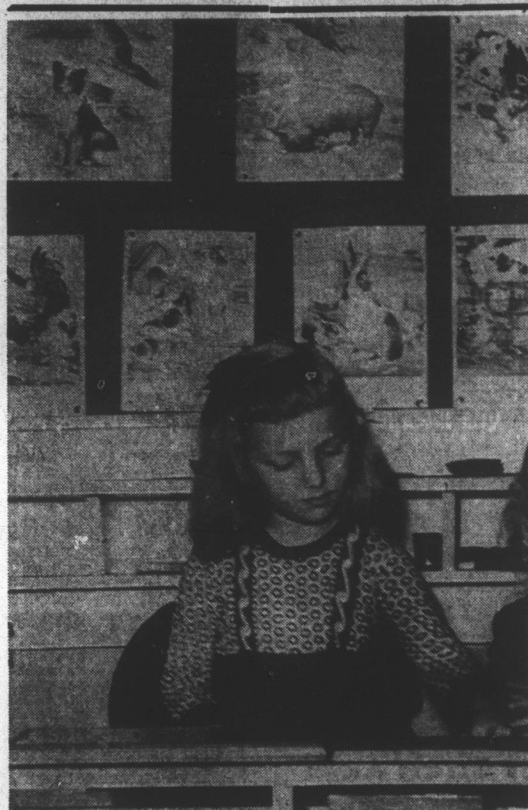

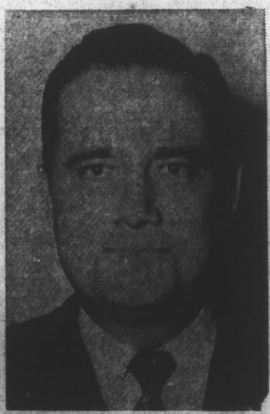
