The Sea Leopard, which recently returned to Norfolk, Va., visited Havana, Cuba, as well as Key West, Fla., Dry Tortugas, and Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.

In Havana, crewmen visited such attractions as cigar factories, famous perfumeries and alligator goods factories. They also saw first hand how the Cubans do the Rhumba.

At Key West and Dry Tortugas, deep sea fishing held the interest of sailors. At Ft. Jefferson, they saw a famous national monument—the impressive United States 19th Century fortress which was used as a Federal prison during the Civil War.

Communists want the right to build new air bases during an armistice and at the same time to limit or prohibit Allied troops rotation.

"The Communists are fooling no one in their efforts to negotiate for a future war in Korea," the broadcast said.

"Sooner or later," it said, the Reds must choose between their demand that they be permitted to build air fields, and an armistice. "It is the choice between peace and war," the broadcast said.

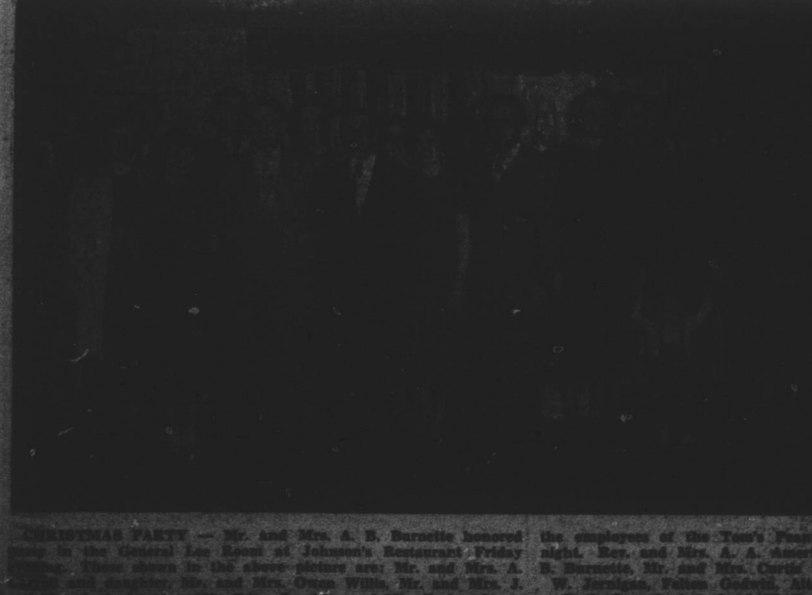

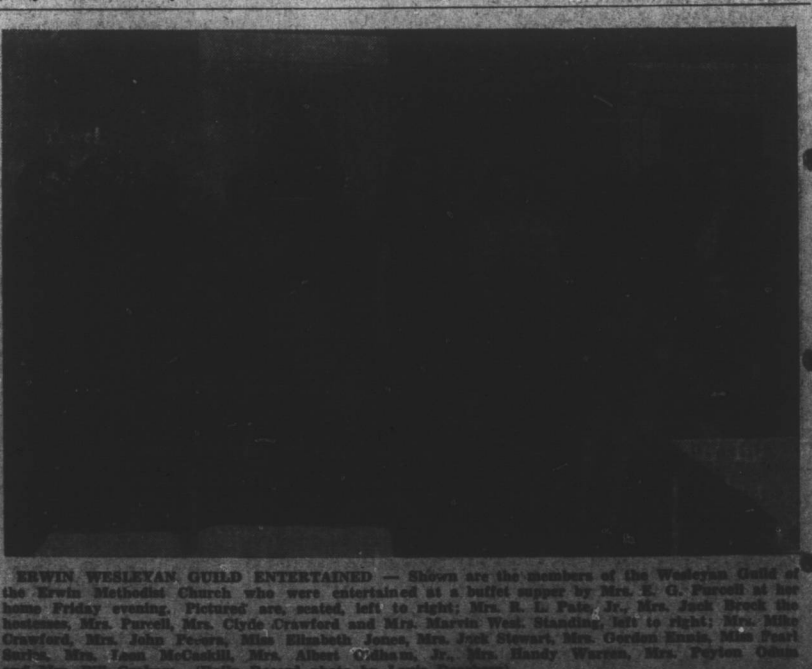
