Student Makes Highest Grade After 2 Beers

PRINCETON, N. J. (AP) — A Princeton University student who snuck out for a couple of beers during an examination and then scored one of the highest marks was acclaimed the "champion relater" of Old Nassau today.

Irrving F. Foots, 21, Fortstown, N. H., a senior, was one of three out of 120 students in an anthropology exam to get top "one plus" marks.

Foots spent the first 45 minutes of his three-hour examination period working on the test. Then he strode from the room — allowed under Princeton's honor system — and went to a corner taproom for a couple of beers and 45 minutes of television.

After getting thoroughly "re-laxed," Foots came back to the exam room, checked his paper and handed it in. Only one other test had been handed in before that.

"I just can't see these fellows who tighten up when they take an exam," Foot said. "As long as you're relaxed, you've got the battle half won."
