McGRATH DEFENDS HIMSELF When Sen. Alexander Wiley of Wisconsin dropped in on his for-mer Senate colleague, now Attor-ney General Howard McGrath, the other day, the latter Jet his hair down

down. McGrath has been weeping on quite a few shoulders around town over the way he has been kicked around by the White House, and has become quite bitter over presscriticism. In talking to Senator Wiley he was almost pathetic in pleading that criticism was unjustified.
