

### Promoter Norris Expects No Trouble From Walcott Manager

By FRANK EDGE JR. (United Press Sports Writer) MIAMI — (AP) — Promoter Jim Norris, backed by contracts and commissions, said today he would insist at tomorrow's "big conference" that Jersey Joe Walcott meet ex-champion Ezzard Charles in a return title bout for the International Boxing Club.

At his suburban Coral Gables home, big brown-haired Jim said he expected "no trouble" from 38-year-old Walcott or manager Felix Boechchio because "I must regard them as men who will honor their contracts until they prove otherwise."

Manager Boechchio has threatened to break away from Norris and his IBC, and have Walcott fight Matthews at Las Vegas in early May unless Norris can match the \$250,000 guarantee offered Walcott by Harry Hunt of Los Angeles. Norris grinned amiably when the break-away threat was mentioned. He said, "I don't believe Felix and Joe would do anything like that. They're too intelligent to get all tangled up in court actions."

### Milwaukee Games Receiving Great Public Interest

"I may eat him tonight," said Witt, the FBI agent who so far this season has failed to best Gehrman. "He can't win with that kick of his forever."

### Leap Year Start

In the 1952 Journal meet, Witt beat Gehrman in a five time looking-one of the three times he has defeated the Wisconsin star in their 18 meetings.

Although Gehrman has beaten the former Indiana U star each of the three times they have clashed this year, each time his margin has been smaller. First it was four yards, then a yard, and last Saturday in New York, just a foot.

HIGH FLYING BOYS The pole vault, matching the Rev. Bob Richards of La Verne, Calif., and Don Laz of the University of Illinois, will press the mile run for tonight's track headlines. Both vault stars have cleared the magic 15-foot mark.

Richards revealed today that peerless Cornelius Warfield, who cleared 15 feet 4 3/4 times and holds the world mark of 15 feet 8 1/2 inches, has been helping him train.

So far, Richards' best vault has been 15 feet, 4 3/4 inches at the Chicago Relays. Laz cleared 15 feet, 1 3/4 inches at Los Angeles a year ago.
