WASHINGTON (AP) - Harold L. Ickes received in death today what he never asked and seldom got in life—a lot of kind words. The "Old Curmudgeon," who was secretary of the Interior for 13 years, died last night in Emergency Hospital. He had been suffering from arthritis for months, and his 77-year-old heart finally gave out.



President Truman, who once felt the lash of Ickes' sharp tongue, was one of the first to pay tribute to the outspoken New Dealer who was known, in admiration rather than irony, as "R.nest Harold." "Although he was often fractious and could be intolerant of the opinions of others," Mr. Truman said, "his sharpest critics never doubted his integrity..."
