For further convenience they will be available from the agriculture teachers at the following schools; Dunn, Benhaven, LaTayette, Angler, Coats Boone Trail Anierson Creek, Lillington, Shawtown and Harnett County Training School.

Ammons points out that it takes the same amount of time and money to raise a heifer from a poor bull as it does from a good one. He believes the artificial insemination program will do much to raise the average milk production and improve dairy herds in the county.

The immediate aim of the program is to bring 3,000 more dairy cattle into the county. There are about 5,000 here at present.
Applications on individual farms call for a membership fee of \$5 for the first service of an animal and a service fee of \$8 for each animal will be set up.


