WHITEVILLE, N. C. (16) — State and local officials said today the arrest of 10 former Ku Klux Klans. men on kidnapping charges has ended a reign of terror in this area.

"I think the whole town of Fair Bluff is, relieved," said Columbus County Sheriff H. Hugh Nance.

"The klan was developing a reign of terror, for which we have no place in North Carolina," commented Gov. Kerr Scott. "I think people are pretty happy about it (the arrests)."

"It's just like being able to breathe again," said Sam Scott, Fair Bluff merchant.

The nightriders were charged with kidnapping and flogging Mrs. Dorothy Martin, 27, and Ben Grainger. 40, of Fair Bluff on Oct. 6.

"I plan to prosecute them to the fullest extent and at the earliest, bossible date," said U. S. Dist, Attorney Charles P. Green in Fayetteville.

The 10, including four officials **S5,000 each and hearings were set before U. S. Commissioner T. L. Hon in Fayetteville Feb. 26 and 27.


