It could even nominate its own candidates for President and Vice-President without consulting any other states. At the very least it could require candidates for Presidential elector, before they are given the Democratic nomination, to swear that they will not under any circumstances cast an electoral vote for Harry S. Truman or anyone else who is for his F.E.P.C. - Fair Deal platform.

The regular Democratic Party won the Presidential election of 1948 in every one of the 11 states of the former Confederate States of America. In four of those states the regular Democratic candidates for Presidential elector were pledged to Thurmond and Wright. THERE WASN'T ANY STATES RIGHTS DEMOCRATIC ("Dixiecrat") PARTY IN ANY OF THE FOUR STATES THAT WERE CARRIED BY THURMOND AND WRIGHT. They were the candidates of the DEMOCRATIC PARTY in those states. You can verify this by writing to the Secretaries of State of Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi and South Carolina.

If the regular Democratic Parties of any four additional Southern states, or Texas and any other two, had nominated Presidential electors pledged to Thurmond and Wright, Truman would have lacked the required majority of 266 electoral votes and the election would have been thrown into the House of Representatives (which elected Thomas Jefferson). In the House each state has one vote, and North Carolina's vote counts as much as New York State's. Unless the Republicans had voted for Truman in the House of Representatives or the Trumanites had voted for someone or later the House would have had to elect Thurmond. THURMOND CAME NEARER TO BEING PRESIDENT THAN THE TRUMANITES AND THE REPUBLICANS. WANTED YOU TO REALIZE. There are already more Southern Democratic Parties pledged to support an independent ticket in 1952 than did so in 1948. With North Carolina added, the chances would be excellent.
