### Miss Kellems **Again Refuses** To Pay Taxes

STONINGTON, Conn. (P - Vivien Kellems, veteran campaigner against "socialistic" federal tax laws, refused today to pay the new social security tax on self-employed persons and recruited four other small employers to join her tax

persons and recruited four other small employers to join her tax strike.

Miss Kellems, who owns a cable grip factory here, sent a letter to Secretary of the Treasury John W Snyder with her income tax return, pointing out that she had not included the \$81 due for the new tax. She told Snyder that she carried "adequate insurance" and did not wish "further coverage."

SUGGESTS INDICTMENT
"It, will clarify the whole matter if you will please indict me and let me submit this law to the Supreme Court, in the traditional American manner, in order to test its constitutionality," she told Snyder in the letter.

Miss Kellems made public similar letters to Snyder written by four others.


