## BIBLE SOCIETY OPENS FUND DRIVE



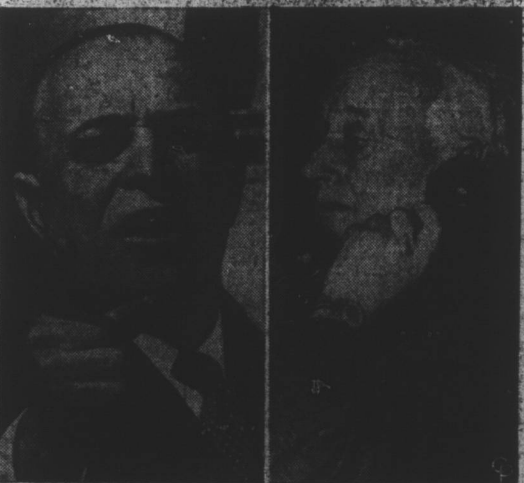

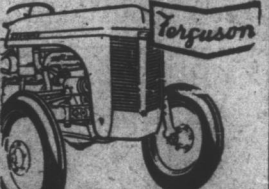

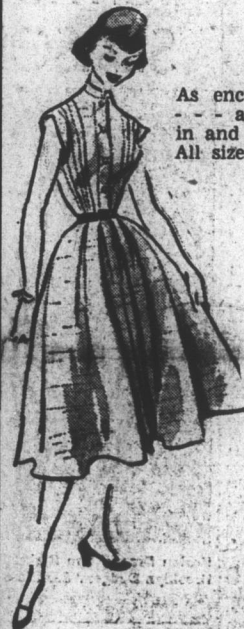
