Murray Perkey, accompanied her to the hospital. He told reporters that telling her the news would be the saddest and hardest thing he ever had to do. He told her on the following Wednesday.

 "I never saw such a brave little girl," he told Mr. Fleishman. "She's got more courage and more spunk than anybody I know."

Merle and her sister, Mrs. Perkey, greeted Mr. Fleishman like a long-lost brother.

All during Merle's stay in the Dunn Hospital, citizens of the community showered her with attention—cards, letters, toys and other gifts. Even entire school groups called at the hospital to inquire about her.

He was elected City Judge of Lake Charles in 1916 and served four terms in that office. In 1917, Judge Braden married Miss Mary Laura Walsh of Covington, La., and they have a son and daughter.

 Judge Braden was elected consul commander of Camp No. 1 at Lake Charles in 1918 and served four consecutive terms. He served two terms as Head Consul of the Louisiana Jurisdiction and was elected to the board of directors of the national organization at the Sovereign Camp Meeting in Seattle in 1922.

Judge Braden is a member of the Episcopal Church and takes an interest in its affairs. In 1924, he became Assistant General Attorney of the Woodmen and moved to Omaha.

He is a member of the Nebraska State Bar Association and the American Bar Association. He was elected national secretary on March 22, 1943 and was named commander-in-chief of the Uniform Rank by the Sovereign Ritualistic Committee on April 11, 1944.

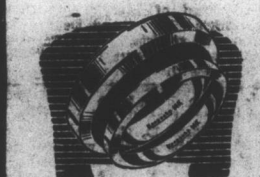

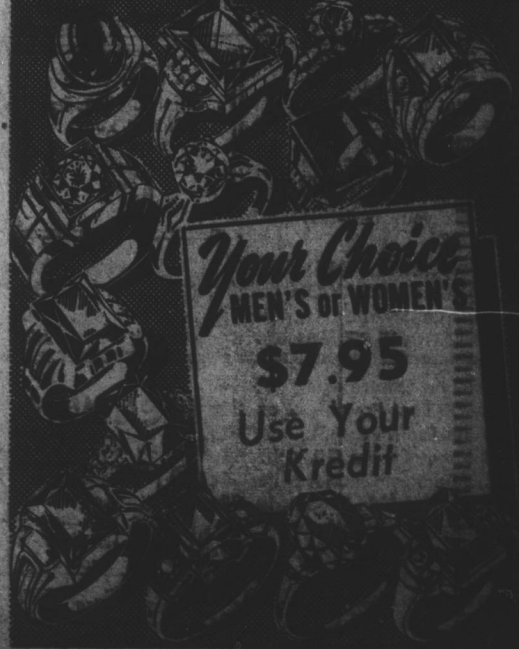
