During play coca-colas were passed and at the end of the game chicken salad and ribbon sandwiches, stuffed dates, cheese balls, potato chips and coffee were served.

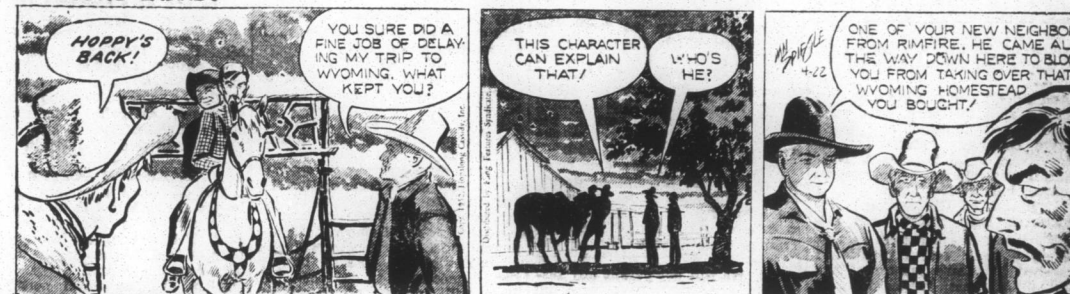

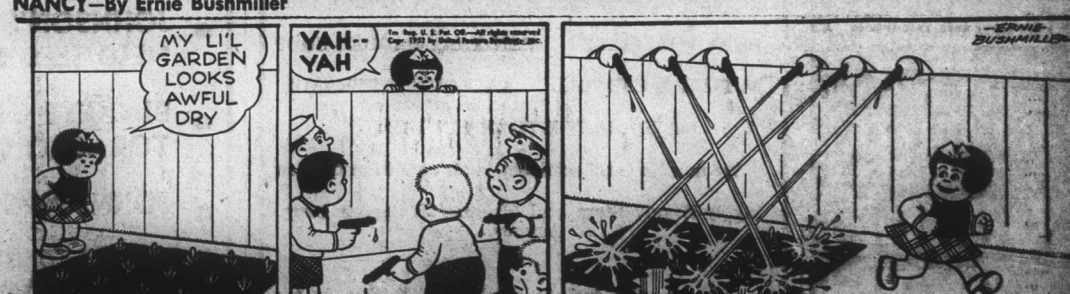

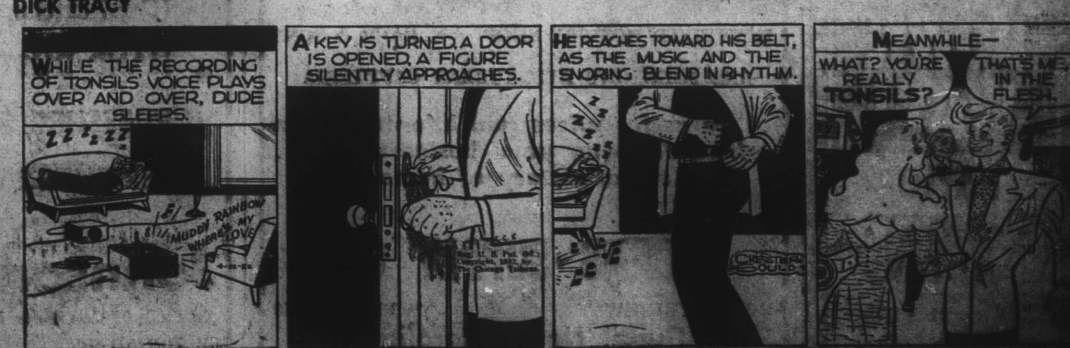
