A mass meeting to discuss the veterans state bonus referendum will be held in the courthouse in Lillington on Wednesday, Nov. 12, at 7:30 p.m.

Andy Del Vesovo of Burlington, State Director of Amvets, sponsors of the bonus referendum, will be in Lillington at that time to discuss the proposed legislation.

"Yes, and I will be in Lillington even if I have to walk," said Del Vesovo who admitted getting his dates mixed and failed to show for the first mass rally set for Oct. 29.

Other county rallies the same week will be Nov. 13 at Snow Hill, Nov. 14 at Swanquarter.
