Doing It With the Left Arm, Hand

WHEN YOU get down to the cause of most of your swing faults you find it is an unruly right side. After you have stud-ied the more obvious ways in which your right side acts when unruly, you should learn that the only effective way to deal with the right side is in having it fol-low the leadership of the left side.

As you labor to master this left side leadership you should find that the old unruly right side, to immediately take over again, needs only the time when you are doing nothing about your left side.

In other words, learning and consistently reproducing the cor-rect swing is an everlasting struggle to have your weaker strugge to have your weaker side lead the stronger. You might call this doing the things you wouldn't do naturally, doing the exact opposite of what you would do impulsively or instinctively.

NOW YOU may regard all this is my personal opinion, nothing more than a theory that I harp on continually because I lack the flexibility to change with the times. If so, then note well the illustrations usually accompanying the text.

As in today's setup, the tieup between text, illustrations and regular performances of the most consistently successful players should be obvious to any reader giving proper attention to the points stressed.

Robinson's title was officially vacated at 12:01 .a.m. because he failed to defend his crown within six months of his last defense, by an announcement by New York State Commission Chairman Robert Christopheomy.

Robinson, meanwhile, who intended to announce his future plans through letters which were to have been made public by Christenberry or the NBA by noon today, was in route by train to Boston when he lost his crown.
