## Glover Will Head Masons At Erwin

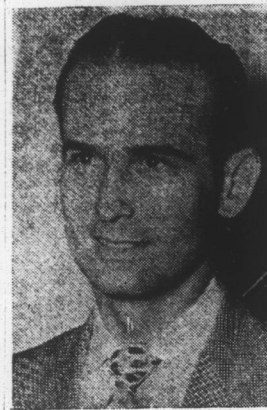
