The report of the Clerk of Courts, submitted to the Harnett County Board of Commissioners, shows receipts totalling \$2,119.22.

A breakdown on the report shows: From probates, \$50.65; from civil and criminal actions and special proceedings in Superior Court, \$222.85; from fines collected in Superior Court, \$50.00; from trust commissions, \$44.32; from civil and criminal actions in Recorder's Court, \$748.00.

Building High For February
