

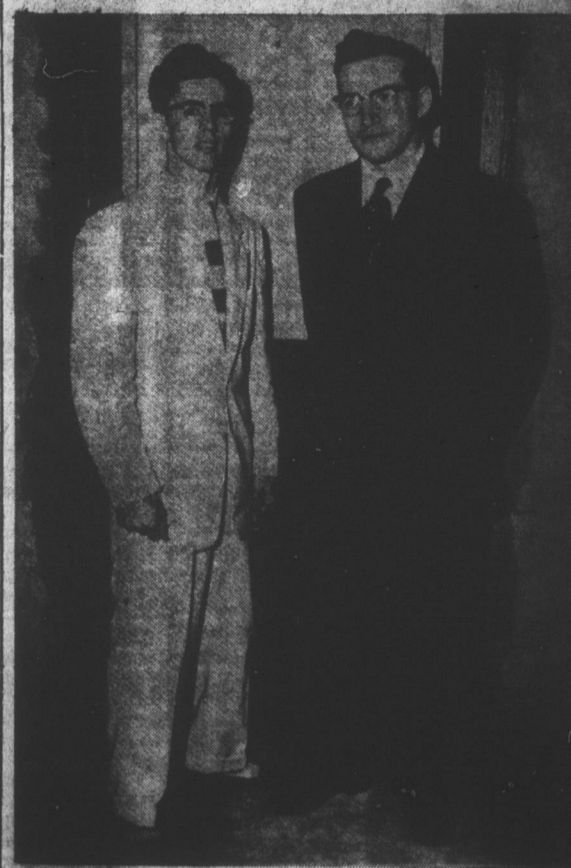

Stassen Under Attack For Holding Report

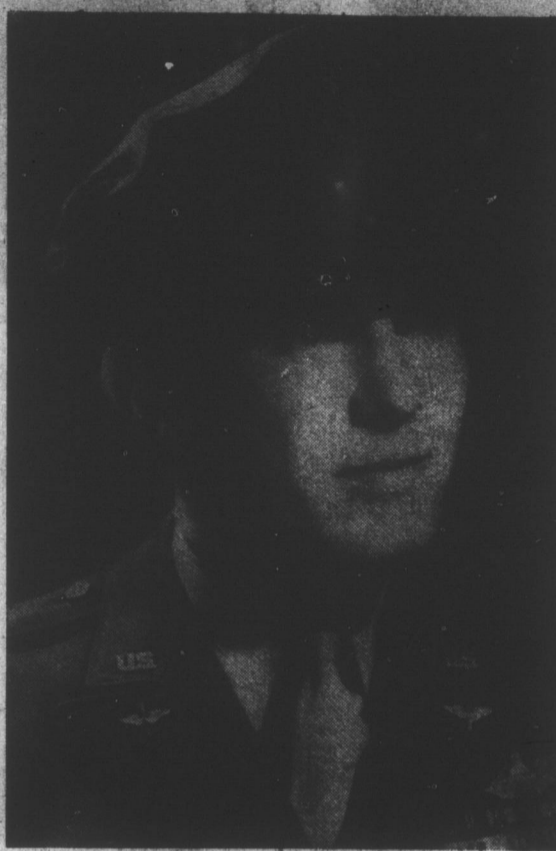
By UNITED PRESS Mutual Security Director Harold E. Stassen came under fire from his own party today for allegedly suppressing an "embarrassing" report calling for abolition of his foreign aid agency.

The report was made by 55 business leaders who surveyed the foreign aid program early this year at the administration's request. The group reported back to President Eisenhower March 24, but nothing has been officially announced on their findings.

Republican congressmen charged that Stassen was "suppressing" the report because it recommends sharp cuts in foreign aid and the transfer of all foreign aid functions to the State Department—a move opposed by both Stassen and Secretary of State John Foster Dulles.

Stassen admitted to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that some of the business leaders had recommended elimination of the Mutual Security Agency but said the administration's \$1,800,000,000 cut in foreign aid was in line with their recommendations.

Air Force Honors Dunn Man's Squad

Lt. Col. Brown's unit, the 342nd Bombardment Squadron, won the safety trophy for a superior flying safety record. Col. Brown received high praise from the Air Force for the achievement of his unit, which reflects outstanding leadership on his part. He has 18 of the big bombers in his unit.

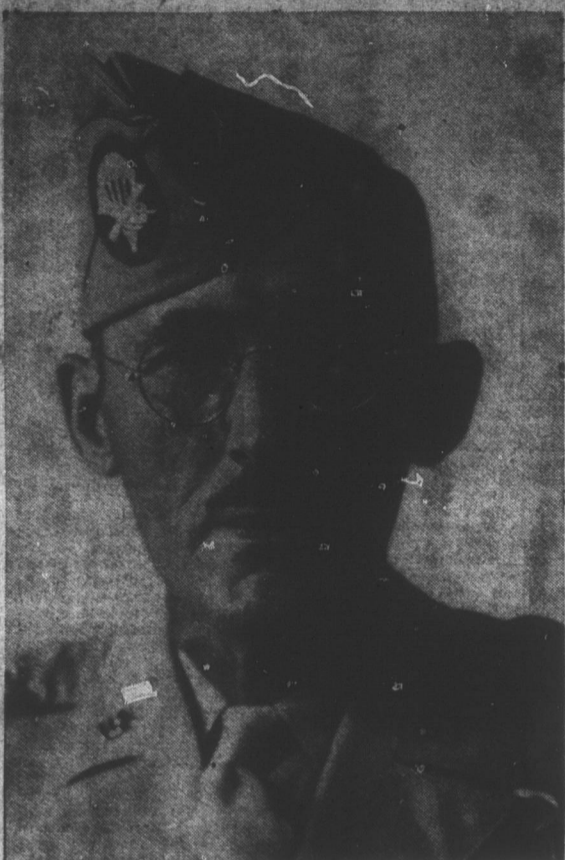
