By UNITED PRESS Mutual Security Director Harold E. Stassen came under fire from his own party today for allegedly supres-sing an "embarrassing" re-port calling for abolition of his foreign aid agency.

his foreign aid agency. The report was made by 55 bus-liness leaders who surveyed the for-legn aid program carly this year at the administration's request. The group reported back to Presiden' Eisenhower March 24, but nothing has been officially announced on their findings. Republican congressmen charged that Stassen was "suppressing" the report because it recommends sharp cuts in foreign aid functions to the State Department—a move opposed by both Stassen and Sec-retary of State John Foster Dulles Stassen admitted to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that some of the business leaders had recommended elimination of the Mutual Security Agency but said the administration's \$1,400,000,000 cut in foreign aid was in line with their recommendations.
