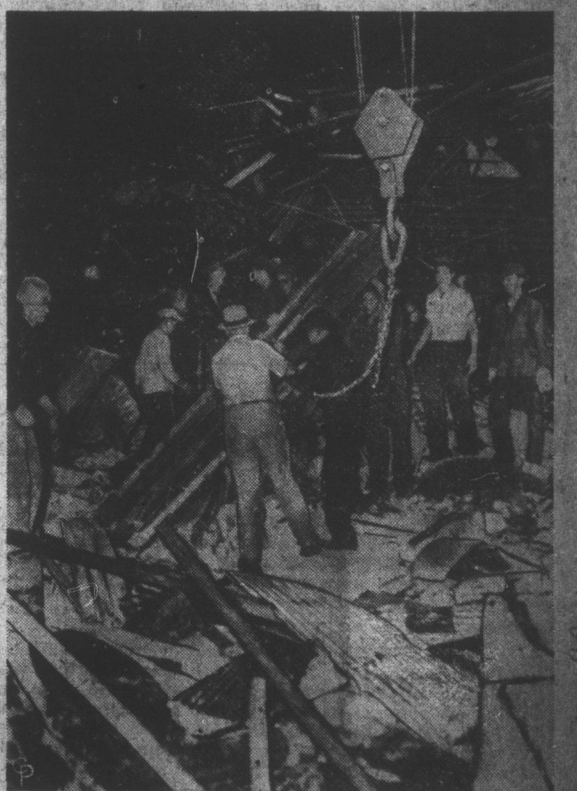
Knowland Warns Britain Planning Far East Munich

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Sen. William F. Knowland (R-Calif.) charged that Britain is preparing for "a Far Eastern Munich," which Knowland contended will make World War III "inevitable."

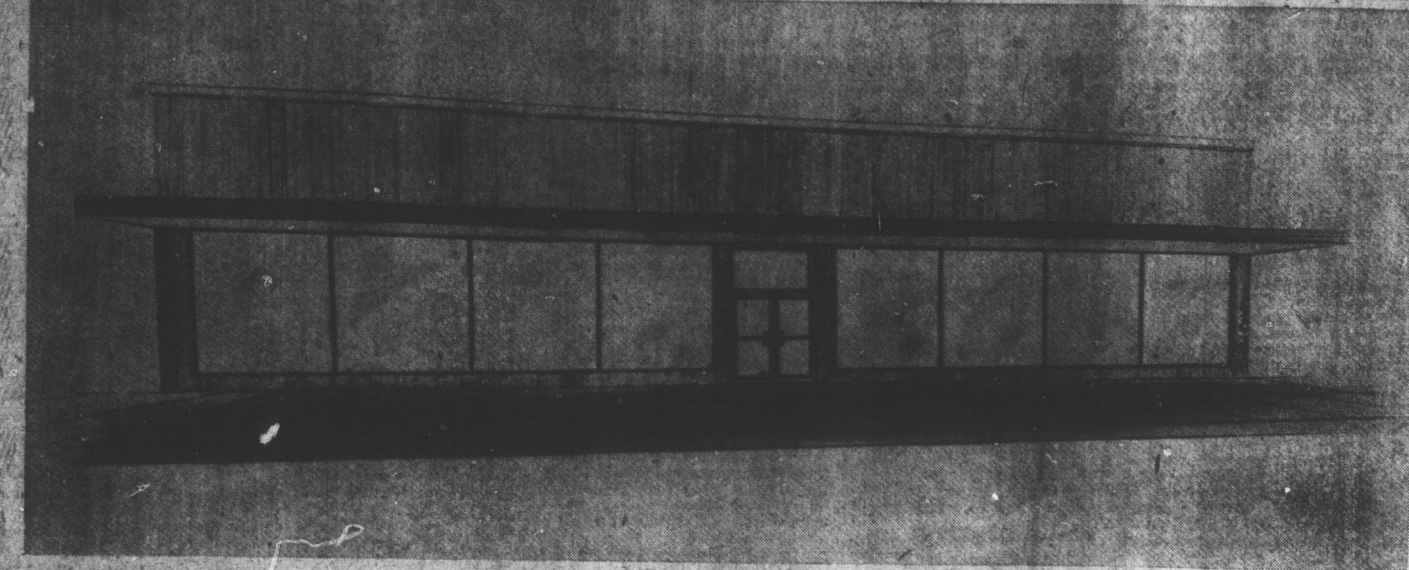
He said also that the recent policy speeches of British Prime Minister Winston Churchill and Labor Party leader Clement R. Attlee indicate the United States will be left in a position of "going it alone" fighting Communists in Asia.

Knowland, in a speech prepared for Senate delivery, condemned the British leaders' speeches, and predicted that the upshot will be an effort to beat Communist China in the United Nations.

83 Dead, 50 Others Missing In Storm

WACO, Tex. (AP) — The faint screams of a woman, apparently a victim of a twister, were heard Monday, today, but a sudden halt to clearance of wreckage of downed buildings by heavy machines.

Workers were afraid to take the chance that someone still alive might be killed by rough handling. There were already 83 known dead here and nine in San Angelo, Tex., for a storm total of 92. And some 60 persons were missing in Waco.

Bulldozers tugging at the tangled wreckage of the Dennis Furniture store were stopped when two operators reported they heard screams from the rain-filled basement, where, rumors were bringing up blood-dashed water.

Dr. Travis White Will Head ACC

Dr. Travis A. White, 48-year-old Texas pastor and educator, was named today as the new president of Atlantic Christian College here by the college board of trustees.

White, pastor of the First Christian Church of Lubbock, Tex., succeeded Dr. D. Ray Lindley, who will come here to assume his new duties July 15 while Lindley leaves June 1 to become administrative vice president of Texas Christian University.

The appointment was announced at noon today by trustee chairman Thomas J. Haddock of Wilson. Haddock said that James M. Monday, academic dean of the college, will serve as acting president until White arrives.

Dr. George Christian of Dunn was a member of the board that selected Dr. White.

White will be the seventh president of the college which was founded by the North Carolina Disciples of Christ in 1902.

A native of Hammond, La., he was graduated from Texas Christian University in 1922 and received his B. D. degree in 1924. He did further graduate work at the University of Chicago in 1925 and at

SEOUL, Korea — (AP) — Nearly 200 United Nations fighter-bombers struck in waves today against troop and supply buildings on an isolated table-top mountain south of Chongju. The allied warplanes flew over the target, on the coastal tidelands of northwest Korea, in Indian file. They dropped high explosives at five to seven-second intervals.

MOSCOW — (AP) — U. S. Ambassador Charles E. Bohlen said today he had conferred 20 minutes with Soviet Foreign Minister Vyacheslav Molotov on "a certain concrete question pending between the United States and the USSR." Molotov received Bohlen yesterday. It was Bohlen's second visit with Molotov but the first was a protocol call concerned with presentation of his credentials.

Norris Re-elected By Coats Voters

J. D. Norris defeated J. B. Williams in the election for Mayor of Coats yesterday by 54 votes. Only 170 voters out of 472 eligible turned out for the municipal election.

When the ballots were counted, Norris had 55 and Williams had 41. In the last election, with a much greater turnout, Norris defeated the same rival by the slim margin of 18 votes.

Only one new commissioner, Curtis Child, was elected to the four-member board of commissioners. He polled 127 votes.

Commissioners nominated and the number of votes each polled were: D. H. Yarbey, 168; L. E. McKnight, 155; Lester Williams, 144; and M. Child, 95.

He said Mr. Thomas was elected by the board of directors to fill out the unexpired term of Wm. W. Howard, who has moved to Raleigh.

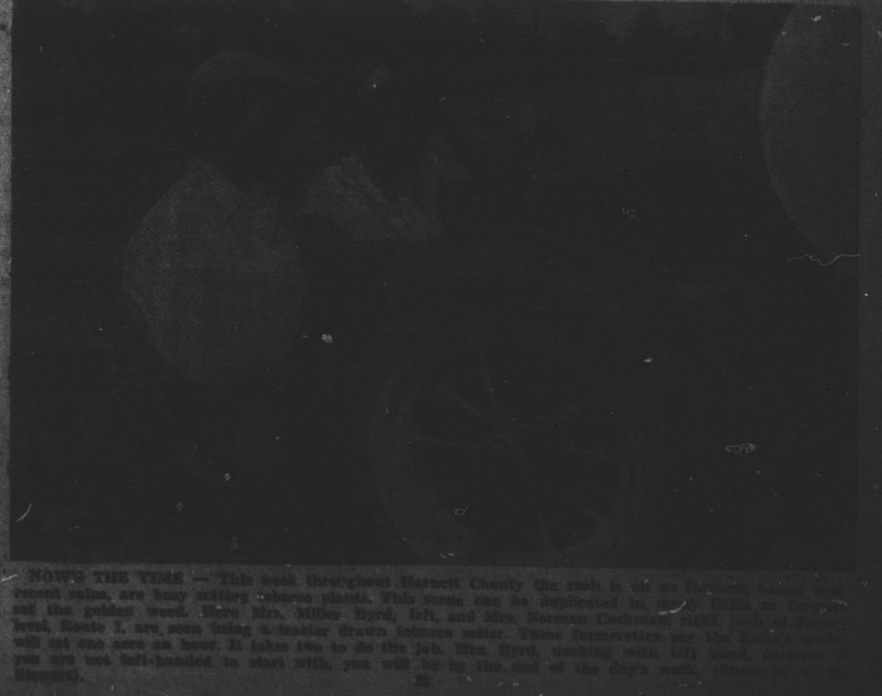
Mr. Thomas, owner of Thomas Walgreen Drug Store, accepted the office this morning and will begin serving at the next meeting of the board.
