**Former Erwin Man Drowned**

FAYETTEVILLE — A local automobile mechanic was drowned Sunday morning while swimming with his nephew in Little River about 14 miles from Fayetteville. Coroner Joe Finkston said Edward House, 21, met death as a result of accidental drowning. No inquest is planned.

House was swimming at Shae Beach, on Little River, with Gene Ray Smith, 14, of Spring Lake, when the accident occurred. The Smith youth told a Fort Bragg public information officer at the scene that he saw House "kind of splash a little bit and then go under." He said he thought House was "just playing around and then I didn't see him any more until he came up on the far side and rolled over and went under again."

Fayetteville and Fort Bragg fire department rescue units were called to the scene and recovered the body some five hours after House disappeared in the river.

He was the son of John Martin House and Fionnie Mae Vann House of Fayetteville. He had attended public schools in Erwin before moving to Fayetteville in 1949.
