**Fireworks Death Toll 8 For Year**  
CHICAGO (AP) — Fireworks have killed at least eight persons in 1953 and maimed, disfigured and injured hundreds more despite tighter laws regulating or prohibiting their use, a survey showed today.

During the Independence Day weekend the United Press counted one fireworks death and at least 66 injuries in which fireworks played a part. In three of the mishaps young boys lost limbs.

But even before the holiday arrived, fireworks had claimed seven lives and caused injuries to 109 persons.

He completed a special two-month study of industrial development of communal settlements in Israel and studied the Arab-Israeli problems at the American Embassy. He is the author of a thesis on "Control and Censorship of College Daily Newspapers." In 1949 he was listed in "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges."

**Active in Young Democratic Clubs of North Carolina**, Conner served as president of the Bertie County YDC, chairman of the Second YDC Congressional District, was a member of the State YDC executive board in 1950 and in 1950-51 served as district organizer for six states and the District of Columbia. He has served on a number of State YDC committees.

He is a member and was first secretary-treasurer of the Bertie County Historical Association. He is also a member of Sigma Delta Chi, national professional journalism fraternity. He was a member of the Kiwanis club in Niles.

Mr. Conner is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Conner. He was recently married to Miss Sara Hege, formerly of the Falcon Orphanage near here. She taught school last year at Vanceboro.
