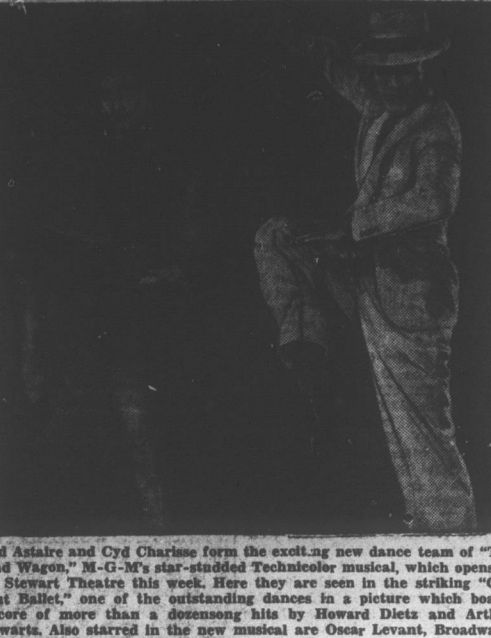

militant crusade against hazing
immediately after an upperclass-
men's raid on a Freshman "smoker,"
held for the "newish" as Wake
Forest Freshmen were called, to get
acquainted with each other. It was
on January, 1936, shortly after the
Christmas holidays, during which
incidentally, Lennon worked in the
Wilmington postoffice delivering
special delivery letters and packages.
The upperclassmen, after warn-
ing President Lennon and other
Freshmen officers against holding
the "smoker," broke it up with
rocks and bricks. —and fence
pallings used for paddles. The pal-
lings were ripped from a fence a-
round Mrs. Perry's boarding house
on North Faculty Ave., where the
Freshmen had gathered for their
get-acquainted party.
Alton and his roommate, Bobby
Fales—now Dr. Robert E. Fales
of Wilmington—were beaten by
pallings as they fled the scene.
They got back to their room, No. 22
EU Inn, with upperclassmen in
howling pursuit.
Quickly, a few friendly upper-
classmen scrambled into the room
to try to help Alton and Bobby. Two
of these were Herchel, Alton's brother,
and Tom Wright of Shiloh.
The upperclassmen ringed the
building. They began pounding on
the door of No. 22.
"We want Lennon!" they yelled.
They considered Alton the active
and symbolic leader of the Fresh-
man Class.
Tom Wright volunteered to be
Alton's decoy. He jumped from the
second-story window of EU and hit
the ground running.
Everybody started yelling: "There
goes Lennon!"
Wright ran through the woods
and out into the darkness with
the upperclassmen in pursuit. Alton
and Bobby were left in uneasy peace
at least for the rest of the night.
Next day Alton and Bobby gather-
ed up iron pipes and rigged up
bars for their door.
That night shortly after supper,
they were sitting on their beds in
their rooms wondering, apprehen-
sively, when the upperclassmen
would strike again.
A friendly Senior ministerial
student, "Sky" Trammel of Ruth-
erfordton, came in the room and
handed Bobby something wrapped
in a newspaper. It was a double-
barrel shotgun.
"Boys," "sky" said, "I'm down
here studying the Good Word. But
I'm sorry for you. You've got to
protect yourselves. This may do
you more good right now than the
Good Word."
