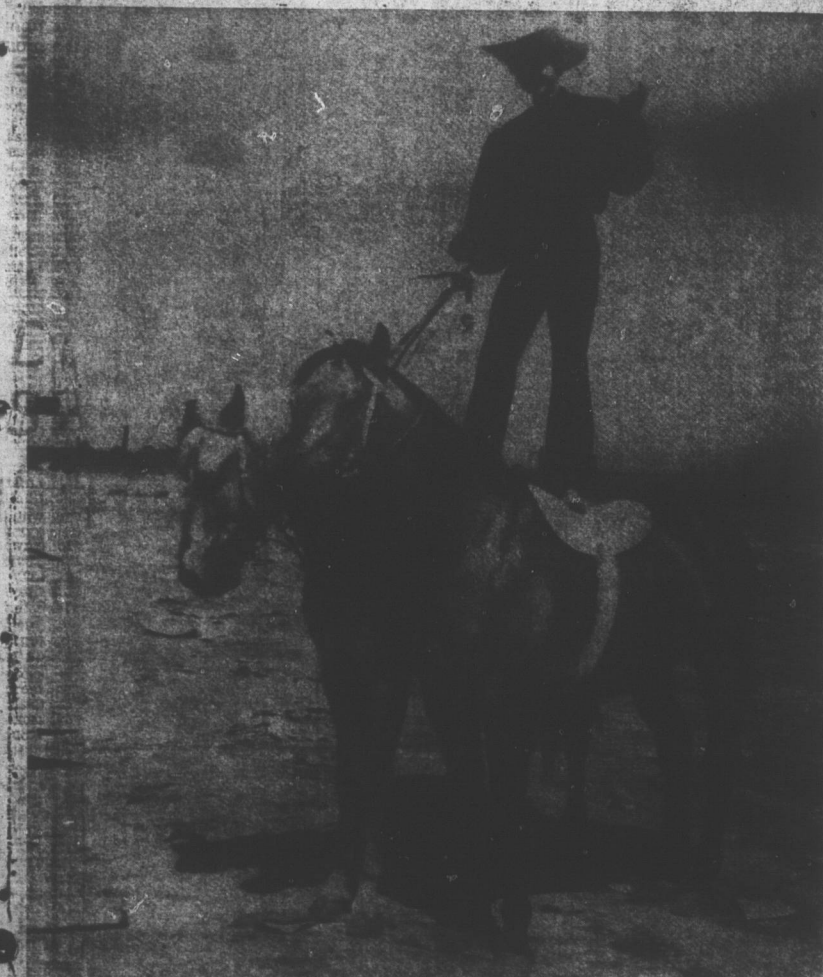

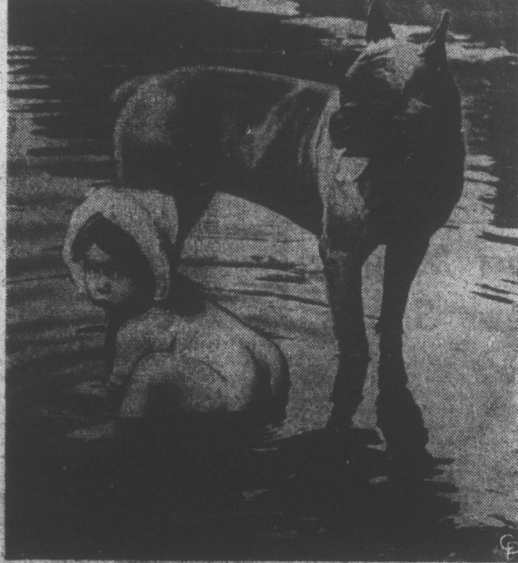
Dunn Man Given \$25,000 Verdict
