County Road Death Toll Sets Record

Highway fatalities have reached an all-time high in Harnett County and Corporal Rommie Williamson of the State Highway Patrol today issued an appeal urging both motorists and pedestrians alike to exercise extreme caution during the dangerous month of December.

On November 28 at 10 p. m., the 24th person died on Harnett's highways since January 1—which broke all existing records for death on the highways in this

death on the highways in this county.

Last year's total of 23 had been the previous highest figure.

Corporal Williamson's report showed that Harnett had 32 accidents during the month of November, with two killed, 13 injured and property damage totaling \$11,395.

This brought the total number of deaths for the first 11 months of the year up to 24; number of accidents to 314, and there have been a total of 176 persons injured and property damage totaling \$175,105 in these accidents.

During 1952, there were 346 accidents in Harnett, with 20 killed, 180 injured and property damage totaling \$351,548.
