Mrs. Kizzie Robertson Farmer, 62, of 123 Spring Branch Road in Dunn, died early Sunday morning at the home of her sister, Mrs. Katie Boyd, in Henderson. She was found dead in bed Sunday morning. Death apparently was caused by a heart attack during the night.

Mrs. Farmer was in Henderson at the time of her death visiting her sister, who is critically ill.

Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Gospel Tabernacle in Dunn. The Rev. Bessie T. Underwood, pastor, and the Rev. J. Luther Davis, pastor emeritus, officiated. Burial was in the Elmwood-Croft Church Cemetery, near Erwin.

The body lay in state at the church for one hour prior to the services.

Mrs. Farmer was a native of Sampson County, daughter of the late George William and Mary Jones West. She had resided in Dunn most of her life.
