Continued From Page One) Alfred H. Noble, chief of the U.S. military assistance group at the Hague, will be the new commander of the Camp Lejeune, N. C. Marine base. Noble succeeds Maj. Gen. Henry D. Lincoln, whose new assignment has not been announced, at Lejeune.

WASHINGTON - The weatherman refused to cooperate today for the opening of the colorful Cherry Blossom Festival which is expected to bring 500,000 persons to the nation's capital. Showers started falling early this morning and the weather bureau predicted the mercury would fall to a not-so-springlike 34 degrees tonight.

CAIRO, Egypt - King Saud of Saudi Arabia saved President Mohammed Naguib from another fall from power in Egypt's tempestuous political crisis, a revolutionary council member said today. The powerful, pro-Western Saud intervened in Naguib's behalf even after the President had been forsaken by the cavalry officers who had swept him back into power after he had been forced out last month.

NEW YORK - The federal government pressed a three-pronged legal attack on the discredited International Longshoremen's Association today in an all-out effort to end a crippling 28-day dock strike in the nation's largest port.

SPOKANE, Wash. - Witnesses said today that a plane B-50 bomber, which turned into a fiery death trap for seven airmen Monday, blazed over "like a giant pan-cake" during the take-off landing exercise. Three crewmen of the huge B-50 engine atom bomb carrier scrambled to safety through escape ladders when the plane crashed and burned at Fairchild Air Force Base about 12 miles from here.

WASHINGTON - President Eisenhower accepted an invitation today to speak informally April 29 to the opening session of the annual meeting of the United States Chamber of Commerce here.

MONTREAL - Montreal's Siamese twins, born along with a third child in a triple birth, are "still doing well" in their fight for life, officials at Catherine Booth Maternity Hospital reported today. The twins, Janet and Janice Savage, are in an incubator and no plans have been made to move them.

WASHINGTON - The Navy plans to drop about 1,000 reserve officers from its active duty ranks during the fiscal year starting next July 1. The officers will be "involuntarily released" in line with budget and manpower cuts.

LONDON - Foreign Operations Administrator Harold E. Stassen met today with Prime Minister Winston Churchill for a second time and there were reports the Big Three were near agreement on liberalizing non-strategic trade with Communist nations.

WASHINGTON - A pert and smiling 5-year-old girl today presented Mrs. Mamie Eisenhower with a sheet of Eastern seals to help crippled children - like herself - run and play like normal youngsters. Brown-eyed Karen Albrecht of San Antonio, Tex., who has never walked without the aid of braces and crutches, flew here with her mother, Mrs. Herbert Albrecht, for her 5th birthday.

WASHINGTON - Defense Secretary Charles E. Wilson today described results of recent H-bomb tests as "unbelievable." He said they demonstrated the mounting peril facing any aggressor who attacks the United States.

WASHINGTON - President Eisenhower handed over a \$1 bill today for the first Buddy Poppy of the Veterans of Foreign Wars 1954 campaign. The sale was made by 6-year-old Ruth Ann Madison in the President's executive office. Ruth Ann lives with her mother, Mrs. Pauline Madison, and five brothers and sisters at the VFW home for widows.

WASHINGTON - The Agriculture Department today increased by about 10 per cent 1954-55 marketing quotas for fire-cured and dark air-cured tobacco. It said the increases were made because specialists sent to Europe in January anticipate additional export markets for the two types of tobacco this season.

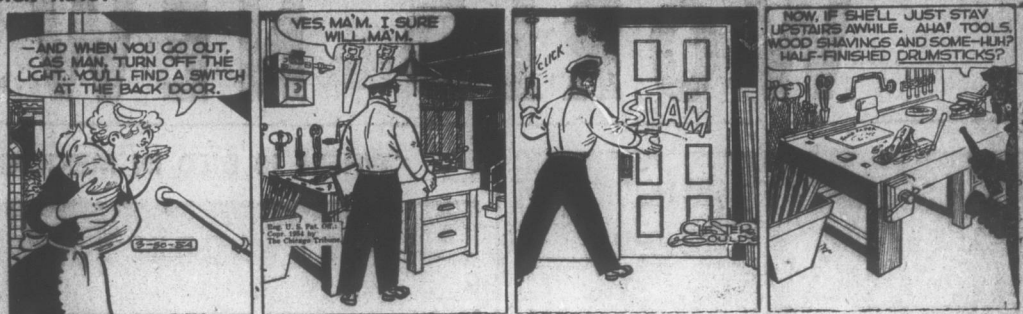
