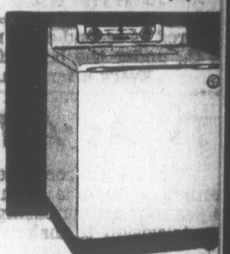
Patrolman Paul Lucas said the Watkins car, traveling north, ran off the shoulder, swerved and the
