At the end of the service the hostesses served sandwiches, sand tarts and iced drinks. The Chestnut home was decorated with attractive bouquets of roses.

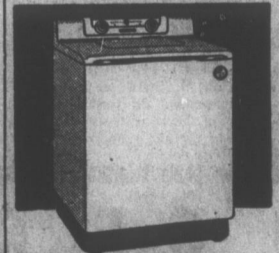
