## School Board Lauds Nichols

Two resolutions of respect to the memory of the late W. E. Nichols, long time member of the county board of education, who died recently were adopted this week by county agencies.

The Board of Education, on which Nichols served for six years, expressed its appreciation of his services. The Board of County Com-

missioners also drew a resolution describing the late Coats business man as one of the county's most "useful citizens."

Nichols died unexpectedly of a heart attack while on a trip to Bermuda.

The resolution from Nichols' co-workers on the county board of education reads as follows:

Resolved: "The Board of Education of Harnett County deeply regrets the loss of a most faithful member in the death of Mr. W. E. Nichols of Coats. In his service on the Board of Education from February, 1948 until his death May 26, 1954, Mr. Nichols played a vital part in promoting the cause

of public education in Harnett County. He was a man of excellent judgement and ability, keenly interested in seeing that all the children in the county had proper educational opportunities. It can be said truthfully of him that his actions and deeds spoke louder than his words. His fine Christian character and life of service to his community and county will continue to inspire the people who knew and loved him. The Board extends to his wife, children and relatives its deepest sympathy."
