would not say whether this country would withdraw from the U.N. if the cause is lost.

ROSE ACTION DECENT

2. He hopes union workers will call off a strike at the atomic plants at Oak Ridge, Tenn., and Paducah, Ky., and await a report from the emergency fact-finding board he appointed last night. An atomic strike would be a very serious thing for the United States, he said.

3. His administration, in supporting measures to end segregation, is doing what it considers decent and just for all the American people and is not supporting any special group.

4. He has the utmost confidence in the integrity, loyalty, and efficiency of Allen W. Dulles, director of the Central Intelligence Agency. He is sure that his old friend, Gen. Mark W. Clark, will do a fine job as head of a Hoover Commission

group which will study the CIA.

5. He has not entirely abandoned hope that Congress will act at this session on statehood for Hawaii. But the outlook is bleak.
