That that portion of Godwin Street lying between Washington, Ave. and Elm Ave.; be and the same is hereby declared a Special Assessment District and that it be improved in the following manner: that there be constructed an asphalt pavement one and one-half inches (1½") thick and twenty feet (20) wide upon the said portion of said street, under and by virtue of section 160-78 of the General Statutes of North Carolina, 1943, as amended.
3. That one hundred per cent (100%) of the total cost of said improvement be hereinafter assessed upon the lots abutting directly upon said portion of Godwin Street, so described herein, exclusive of so much of the total cost as is included in improving the street intersections, according to the extent of the respective frontages by an equal rate per lineal foot of such frontage;
4. That the assessment herein provided for shall be payable in cash, or, if the property owner should elect and so give notice in writing to the Clerk of the Town in accordance with the provisions of section 160-92, General Statutes of North Carolina, as amended, he shall have the option and privilege of paying the assessment in five equal installments, said in-

stallments to bear interest at six per cent (6%) per annum;
