#### **New Hurricane Named Janet** On The Way

MIAMI (P) - Hurricane Janet generated 115 - milean-hour winds today before she was 24 hours old and bore down on the Windward Islands in the West Indies with all her fury.

The San Juan Weather Bureau located the storm at 11 a, m. EST 140 miles southeast of Martinique 12.9 north latitude, 59.5 feet longitude. It was moving westward at 15 miles an hour. Janet's present course would take her across the Caribbean Sea and into Central America.

The Weather Bureau raised huricane warnings in the Windward Islands from St. Lucia to Grenada and storm warnings north of St. Lucia to Dominica and south of Grenada to Tobago. The powerful hurricane, discovered by ships only last night blasted Bridgetown, the capital of Barbados Island, about

The 10th tropical tempest of 1955 assed a few miles south of Barbados but the big storm sent its gale force winds outward 120 miles in the northern half and 80 miles the southern half.

The San Juan Weather Bureau said the already-powerful blow would continue to increase in in-tensity and size.

#### **Delivers Major Policy Speech** At UN Meet

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (P) — Secretary of State John Foster Dulles today offered Russia an "overall plan of European security" in exchange for the reunification of Germany.

In a major poncy speech to the United Nations General Assembly, Dulles said international cooperation could make the next 10 years "the healing decade of true peace" if the "new spirit" achieved at Geneva is carried out.

#### MOLOTOV APPLAUDS

Soviet foreign Minister Yacheslav M. Molotov, who will address the Assembly tomorrow, joined in the rolling round of applause from 1,000 delegates as Dulles concluded 40-minute American foreign policy review.

"The German people," Dulies said, "have now been forcifully divided for over 10 years. The perpetuation of this division is a crime against nature

#### UNIFIED GERMANY

He pointed out that some counries feel their own security requires a unified Germany as part of Western European defense ar-rangements. Others, he said, "profess to feel that a united Germany within NATO would endanger

"To bridge this difference," he said, "the Western powers are ready to advance some overall plan of European security which would give the Soviet Union substantial additional reassurances .

"The present opportunity is so unusual and so full of constructive possibilities that it can be hoped that the forthcoming four powers foreign minisers meeting in Geneva next month will find a solid basis for the reunfication of Germany within a framework of European security."
