The General Assembly's main political committee brushed aside the Soviet demand for an arms debate and adopted, by a 49 to 5 vote with 2 absententions.

Forty Sports Cars In Raleigh Race

RALEIGH - Forty flashy sports cars of American and foreign make will race at the Raleigh Speedway Saturday night (October 29) in several events sponsored by the North Carolina division of Sports Car Clubs of America.

It will be the last race program of the season at the Speedway. The Saturday night events, presented on the high-banked mile track, will include 77 laps of racing and a gymkhana in which all competitors will run an intricate

obstacle course against time. The gymkhana will lead off the program at 7:30 o'clock. Members of SCCA will serve as officials.

Five races are on the program, including a relay race between teams of cars. The feature will be a 25-mile sprint for all cars. There will be a 10-mile race for MG class cars; a 20-mile race for cars under 3,000 cc, and a 20-mile race for cars over 3,000 cc.

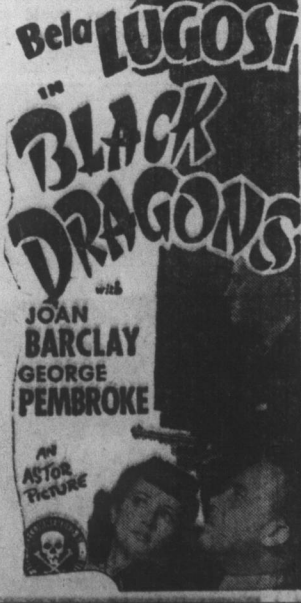
