WASHINGTON (P) credible witness holding high office in the Eisenhower administration reports that he was offered a bet of 10-toone that none of the three most widely discussed Democrats would be nominated for president this year.

The three are Adlai E. Stevenson, Sen. Estes Kefauver and Gov. Averell Harriman. He took the bet, putting up one dollar to collect \$10 if all three strike out.

The other bettor argued it this way: Kefauver is likely to wound Stevenson's chances fatally in one or more of the presidential primary contests in which they willoppose each other. They will meet in New Hampshire March 13, Minnesota March 202, Florida May 8. and California June 5

Having disposed of Stevenson in the primaries, the better continued. Kefauver would be knocked off, in turn, by the combined opposition of the Stevenson element, southern conservatives and the old guard. The Democratic old guard is mostly Harry S. Truman, Independence, Mo.

Myers Will Refuse To Tell Committee

The House Un - American Activities Committee will have to look further than himself to find a cooperative witness, John V. Myers, Campbell College teacher, declared yesterday afternoon.

Breaking the news that he has been summoned to appear before a March 12 hearing of the committee in Charlotte, the rangy, six-footthree language teacher and golf coach said:

"I intend to be an uncooperative witness. I realize this may make it tougher for me, but I believe I have to make a stand."

Two witnesses of the government have thrown the laber "Communist" at him, Myers said. He has been depicted in newspaper accounts as having a connection with Junius Scales, who was convicted as a Communist leader and is now on appeal to the Supreme Court. Myers is 39 years old, a Sunday

School teacher, and the son of a geant who served in the Pacific Theater during the war. Three times wounded, he received the Brown Baptist minister. He is an ex-serwounded, he received the Bronze Star for helping protect wounded soldiers during a Japanese attack.
