

APPARENT DOUBLE SUICIDE

Sheriff And Lover Are Found Dead

PENSACOLA, Fla. (AP) — The bodies of an Alabama sheriff and an attractive 23-year-old Pensacola girl were found today in a parked automobile 20 miles north of here. The county medical examiner labeled their deaths "an apparent double suicide."

Both Sheriff John Brock of Conecuh County, Ala., and Myrtle Lasser, who lived with an aunt here, have been missing since March 4. They were the objects of a wide local search.

Two men, Charles Brantley of Flomaton, Ala., and James Ward, of Molina, Fla., found the bodies in a parked car near Pine Valley. Police said a rubber hose ran from the exhaust pipe. The windows were closed.

Brock, 47, and the brown-haired girl were found sprawled across the back seat of the car in a heavily wooded area.

Dr. Gretchen Squires, county

medical examiner, said it was "an apparent double suicide by asphyxiation."

State Atty. Ed Wickes, however, ordered an autopsy to determine "definitely" the cause of death.

There was no suicide note. The thin, sandy-haired sheriff recently had separated from his wife.

Louis Bromfield Dies In Columbus

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Louis Bromfield, 59, noted author, lecturer and conservationist who contributed many new principles to scientific farming, died last night of a liver and kidney infection.

The Pulitzer Prize winning novelist was admitted to University Hospital here Feb. 28 for treatment of homologous serum jaundice.

Relatives said Bromfield's body will be cremated. A memorial service will be held at 3 p. m. Thursday at the First Congregational Church in Mansfield.

RESOLUTION

On Motion of Commissioner Bryan and seconded by Commissioner Godwin the Following resolution was introduced.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWN OF DUNN

WHEREAS, it has been necessary by the North Carolina State Highway and Public Works Commission to connect with Clinton Avenue in the Town of Dunn; and Whereas, on the 20th day of June 1955, the property owners on that portion of Clinton Avenue, lying between Edgerton Street and Johnson Street, filed with Chas. R. Storey, Clerk of the Town of Dunn, a petition for improving said portion of Clinton Avenue in the following manner: "To construct concrete curb and gutter on both sides of Clinton Avenue;" and

WHEREAS, the said Clerk of the Town of Dunn has certified to this Board that the said petition is sufficient in all respects, the same having signed by a majority in number of the owners of property upon said portion Clinton Avenue and who also represents a majority of all the lineal feet of frontage of lands abutting upon that portion of Clinton Avenue, lying between Edgerton Street and Johnson Street.

1. That the above mentioned partition is found to be sufficient in all respects;

2. That that portion of Clinton Avenue, lying between Edgerton Street and Johnson Street, be and the same is hereby declared a Special Assessment District and that it be improved in the following manner; that curb and gutter be constructed upon both sides of Clinton Avenue so described under and by virtue of Section 160-76, G. S. of North Carolina; 1943, as amended, and that the said improvement be done by contract with the North Carolina State Highway and Public Works Commission under the provisions of Section 136-27, G. S. of North Carolina.

3. That 56.41 percentage of the total costs of said improvements be hereinafter assessed upon the lots abutting directly upon that portion of Clinton Avenue so described herein, exclusive of so much of the total cost as is included in improving the street intersections, according to the extent of the respective frontages by an equal rate per lineal foot of such frontage;

4. That the assessment herein provided for shall be payable in cash, or, if the property owner shall elect and so give notice in writing to the Clerk of the Town of Dunn in accordance with the provisions of Section 160-92, General Statutes of North Carolina, as amended, he shall the option and privilege of paying assessment in five equal installments, said installments to bear interest at six per cent per annum.

5. That this resolution shall be published in the Dunn Dispatch and the Daily Record Newspapers published in the Town of Dunn on the 12th day of March 1956, and on the 19th day of March 1956.

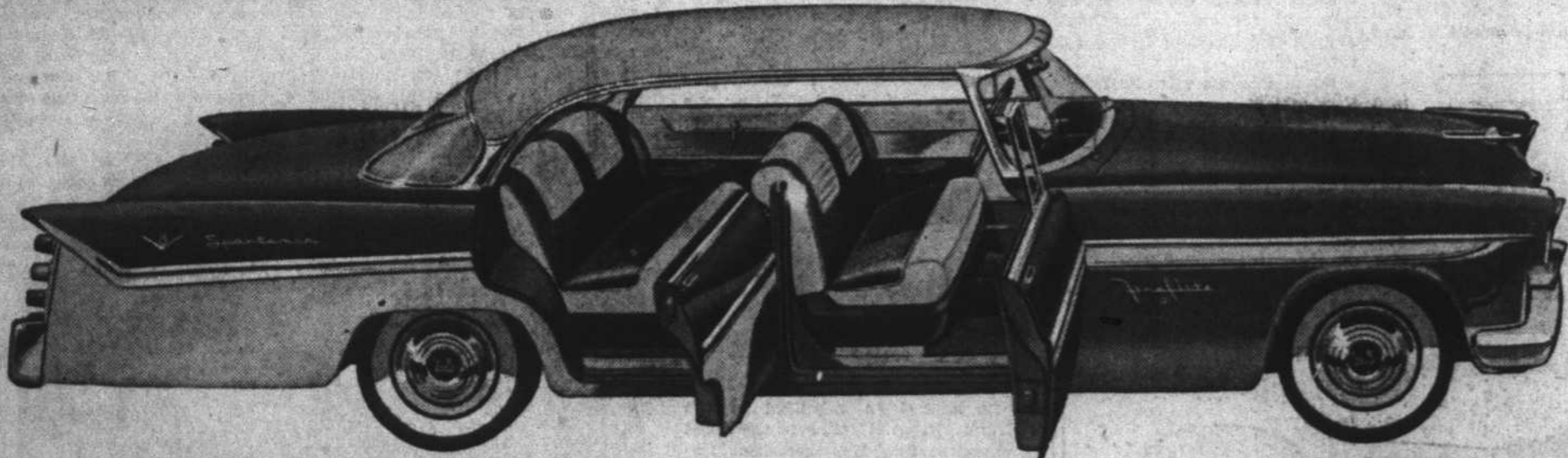
